# Impact Report 2020/21

## The Difference We Made

During this extraordinary year of lockdowns and constant change, the M6 team mantra became 'let's do what we can do, safely': proactively manage risk, respond to need, and embrace innovative ways of working to survive in whatever new landscape emerges in performance for young audiences (PYA).

#### We recommitted to:

- Making ambitious, original theatre with, for and by children and young people that is engaging, multi-layered, and nurtures empathy, respect and emotional literacy.
- **2.** Ensuring our work reaches and is relevant to our local community and under-served audiences in areas of low arts engagement and multiple deprivations.
- **3.** Building on our 40+ year track record, using theatre as a tool for positive change that unlocks the potential of children and young people and responds to the challenges of living in contemporary Britain and the modern world.
- **4.** Championing diversity and nurturing creative talent, especially under-represented artists and diverse new voices.
- **5.** Expanding our reach and impact by listening to and respectfully learning from a range of collaborative partners, children and adult experts.
- **6.** Using our position to address the biggest challenges of our time: environmental responsibility, cultural education and equality.

From our base in Rochdale, we pledged to make the most of what we had to ensure that M6 and the PYA sector survives: to help rebalance cultural deprivation, reignite the imaginations and ambitions of our young people, and nourish strategic partnerships.

Whilst many organisations had to furlough entire teams of staff, our small team continued to operate at 80% capacity. We swiftly adapted delivery plans to new digital interventions, supporting underserved children, young people and their families. We developed a range of new products, projects and services, responding to need and supporting freelance creative artists. As a result, we have increased our visibility, reach, impact and partner relationships, an exceptional silver lining which deserves recognition.

The highlights capture the output and impact but none of this could have been achieved without our amazing, dedicated and highly-skilled team of staff and board, along with our funders. We thank them for their resilience, adaptability and belief that together we could continue to make a positive difference in the most challenging of times.

# **Highlights**

Despite the odds, we managed a live one-week Christmas residency of Little Gift (ages 3+) at The North Wall, Oxford.



Created and streamed Love in the Time of Corona, ten brand new monologues written for young audiences in response to the pandemic. These new works were produced following an online competition, open to writers of any experience. A range of educational resources were also created and sent to 68 primary and 14 secondary partner schools. The monologues were used by **Story Box Theatre** in Todmorden to support young people in achieving their Silver Arts Award and This Corona Chick was performed live at an evening of performance by black artists at the New Diorama



Alongside a 16-venue virtual national tour of When We Started Singing (ages 5+), children from culturally different backgrounds in 20 Rochdale primary schools connected to enjoy a zoom workshop and screening as part of the Linking Schools project. The National Linking Network also shared the package to schools in 28 different geographic areas nationwide. The film began life as one of the winning entries in M6's lockdown monologue writing competition. A BSL version was also created which was highly praised by the Deaf Education Service. Produced a brand-new film version of **The Storm**. after the live tour was cut short due to COVID. This single voice play and accompanying resource for Year 7s confronts issues surrounding climate change.

Streamed three archive shows to support home learning during lockdown: Whatever the Weather was accompanied by the local distribution of 2900 books and 5000 activity packs:

A Tiger's Tale was also programmed as part of the Nottstopping festival at Lakeside Arts: and One Little Word received a limited release for local communities.

Supported four diverse **Youth Theatre groups** to meet online (and in the building when lockdown allowed) to devise their own original films and radio plays. These were shared online throughout the year. Three online masterclasses also took place for youth theatre members to learn skills in television production, continuity announcing and playwrighting.



Continued to work in partnership with **Barnardo's** to support young people living with disability to participate in our Act to Shine youth theatre group. Alongside online sessions, creative activity packs were produced to support participants when they were unable to attend sessions in the building.



Collaborated with **Proud and Loud Arts** and Chrissy Jones, an emerging learning disabled artist, to develop the next phase of Chrissy's TYA production Shadow Girl.



Signed a commitment with MAST to act and support Manchester to be a carbon zero city by 2038.
